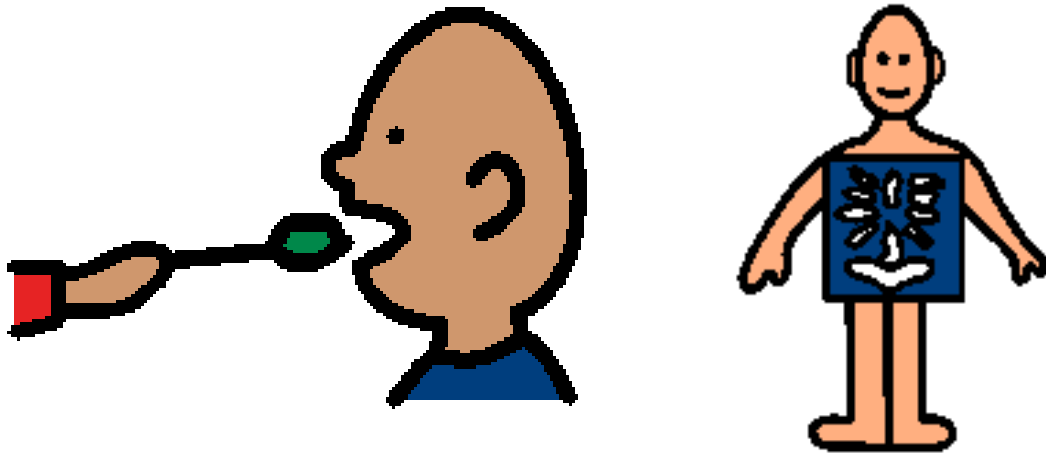

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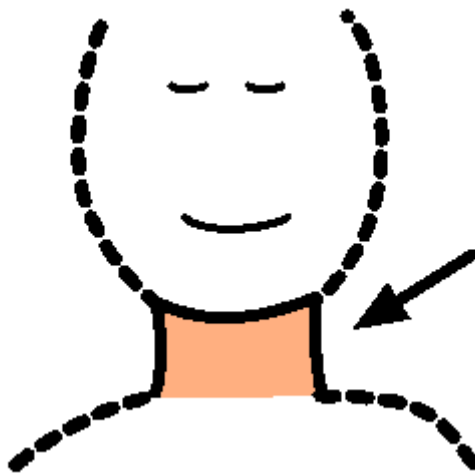
What is a Videofluoroscopy?

A Videofluoroscopy is an **x-ray** of your **swallow**.



Why do I need a Videofluoroscopy?

A **stroke** or **brain injury** can make your swallowing muscles **weak**.

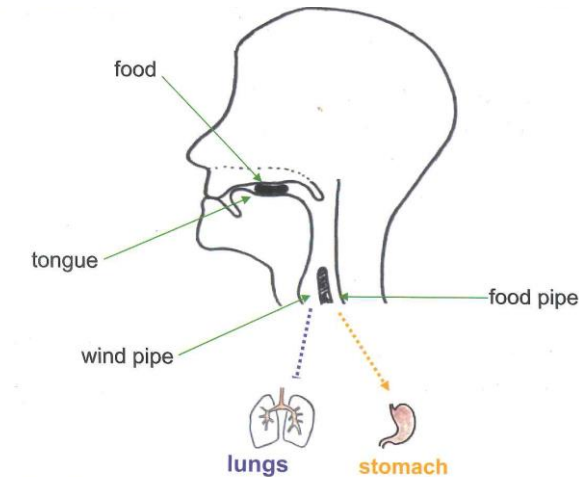


Why do I need a Videofluoroscopy?

Food and drink can go down the **wrong way**.

Food and drink can go into your **lungs**.

This can make you **ill**.



Why do I need a Videofluoroscopy?

An **x-ray** will show what you can **eat** and **drink safely**.



Where is it?

The **x-ray** department at **Wigan** or **Leigh** hospital.



Who will be there?

Speech and Language **Therapists**



Who will be there?

A **Doctor** or **Radiographer**



Who will be there?

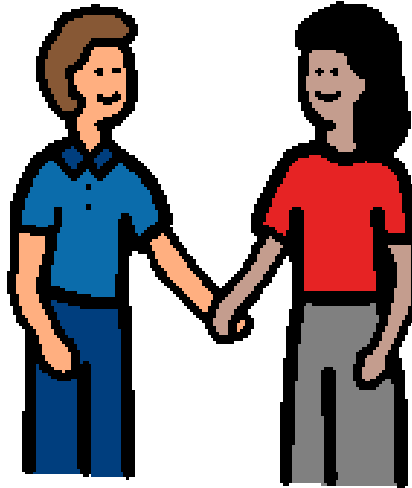
Students may be there too.



Who will be there?

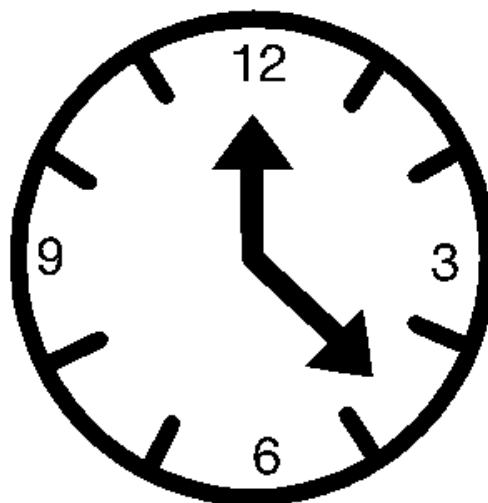
A **family** member or **friend** can come with you.

A **member of staff** can come with you.



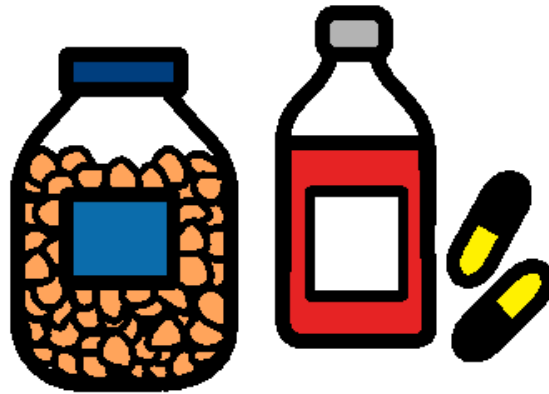
How long will it take?

The x-ray will take about **30 minutes**.



What should I do before the x-ray?

You can take your **tablets** as **normal**.



What should I do before the x-ray?

You can **eat** and **drink**, or have your **usual feed** as **recommended** before the x-ray.



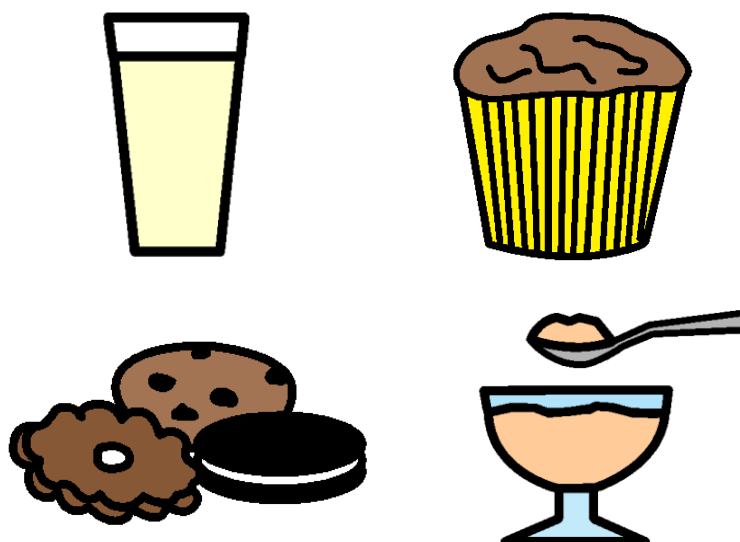
What will happen?

You will **sit** in the x-ray **machine**.



What will happen?

You will be given different **food** and **drinks**.



What will happen?

The food and drinks will be mixed with **barium**.

Barium is a **powder**.

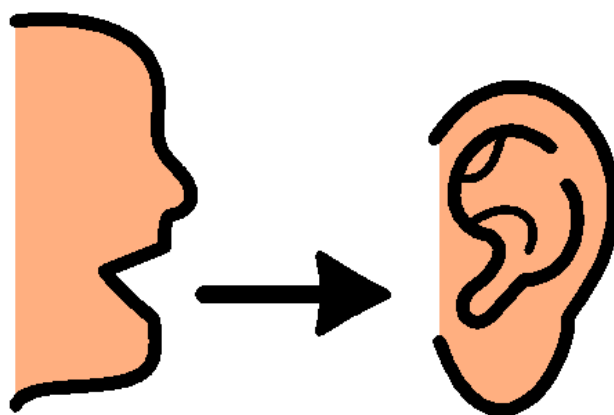
Barium will give food a **chalky** taste.

Barium will make the **food** and **drink** show up on **x-ray**.



What will happen?

You will need to **listen** carefully to the **instructions**.



Results

The Speech and Language Therapist will **look** at the **x-ray pictures**.



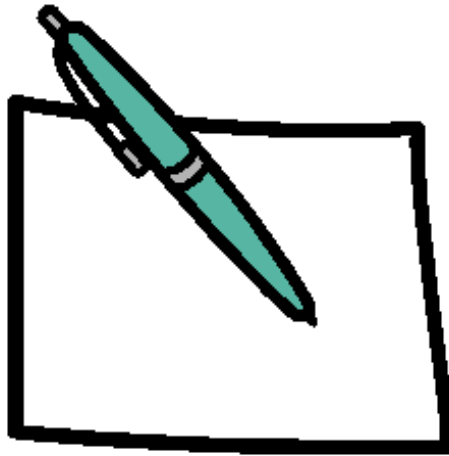
Results

The Speech Therapist will tell you what you can **eat** and **drink**.



Results

A **report** will be sent to your **Doctor**.



Risks

Food and **drink** could go into your **lungs**.

This could give you a **chest infection**.

This is a **small** risk.



Risks

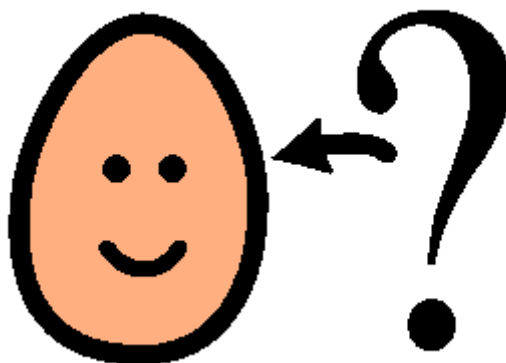
X-ray uses **radiation**.

This is a **small** risk.



If you don't have the Videofluoroscopy

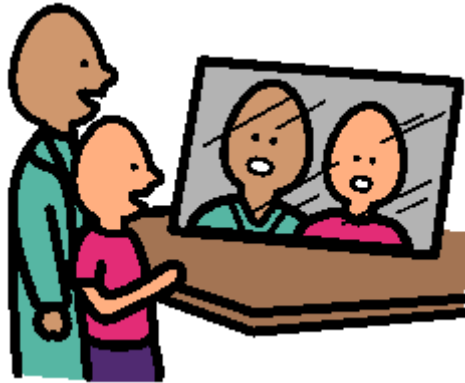
The Speech and Language Therapist **won't know** if your swallow is **safe**.

Exercises can **help** your swallow get **better**.



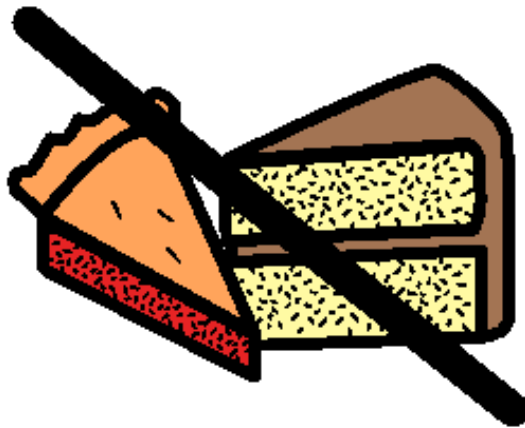
If you don't have the Videofluoroscopy

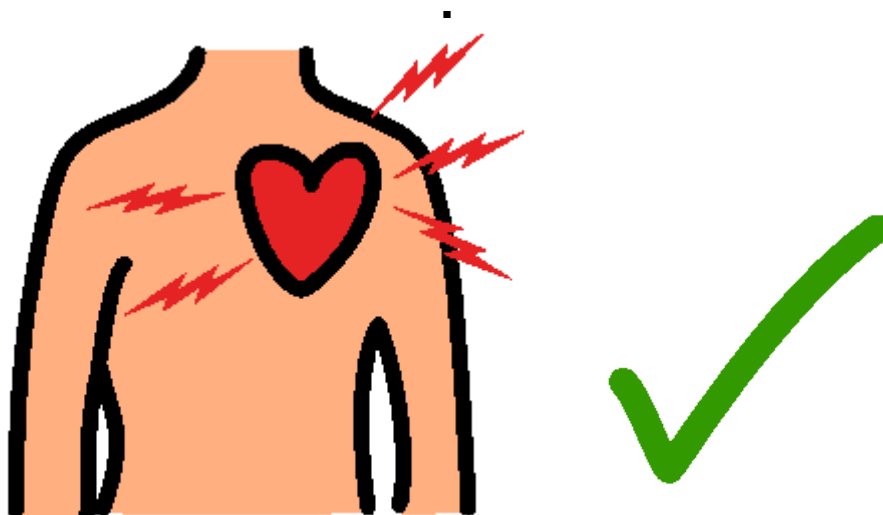
Other information
